# Beretta M9A4-G

9MM • FDE • 5.2" THREADED • OPTICS-READY

*Thirty-two years as America's service pistol, and this is the version the M9 was always trying to become — optics-ready, threaded for a can, 18 rounds, tritium sights.*

## A LEGEND OF TWO WARS

In 1985 the Beretta 92 outshot everything the US trials could throw at it, ended the 1911's seventy-four-year reign, and became the M9 — the standard sidearm of the American military for the next three decades. It went ashore in Panama in '89, rode through Desert Storm and Mogadishu, and then fought the whole Global War on Terror: Baghdad checkpoint shifts, Fallujah room-clearing, night rotations in the Hindu Kush. In the war photographs of an entire generation, the pistol on the hip is this one.

It earned its place the unglamorous way — as the gun that was simply THERE, hot and sanded and passed from rotation to rotation, and kept working. The open-top slide that makes a 92 look old-fashioned is the design's signature: most of the slide IS the ejection port, so there is almost nothing to foul, and the P38-derived falling locking block keeps the barrel on line instead of tilting it. Soldiers trusted it because it gave them reasons to.

## THIS ONE

The M9A4 is the legend's final form. In 2014 Beretta offered the Army the M9A3 — thin Vertec grip, rail, threaded barrel,

real sights — and the Army chose a new competition instead. Beretta finished the pistol for everyone else: the full A3 package, plus the optics-cut slide and 18-round magazines the fleet never got, plus the G decock-only lever it first built for the French Gendarmerie — hammer down, dots up, nothing to sweep on the draw.

Inside is the part the spec table undersells: the Xtreme Trigger System, Beretta's upgraded trigger group with a full DLC coating cutting friction between components — a crisper break and a shorter reset than any service M9 carried. The configuration serious 92 shooters build toward, from the factory.

## RUNNING IT

The slide arrives cut for an optic under Beretta's plate system — pick the plate for your footprint, mount the dot, and the tritium irons are still there beneath it. The muzzle is threaded from the factory, so a 9mm can spins straight on. In the case: the pistol and three factory 18-round magazines.
